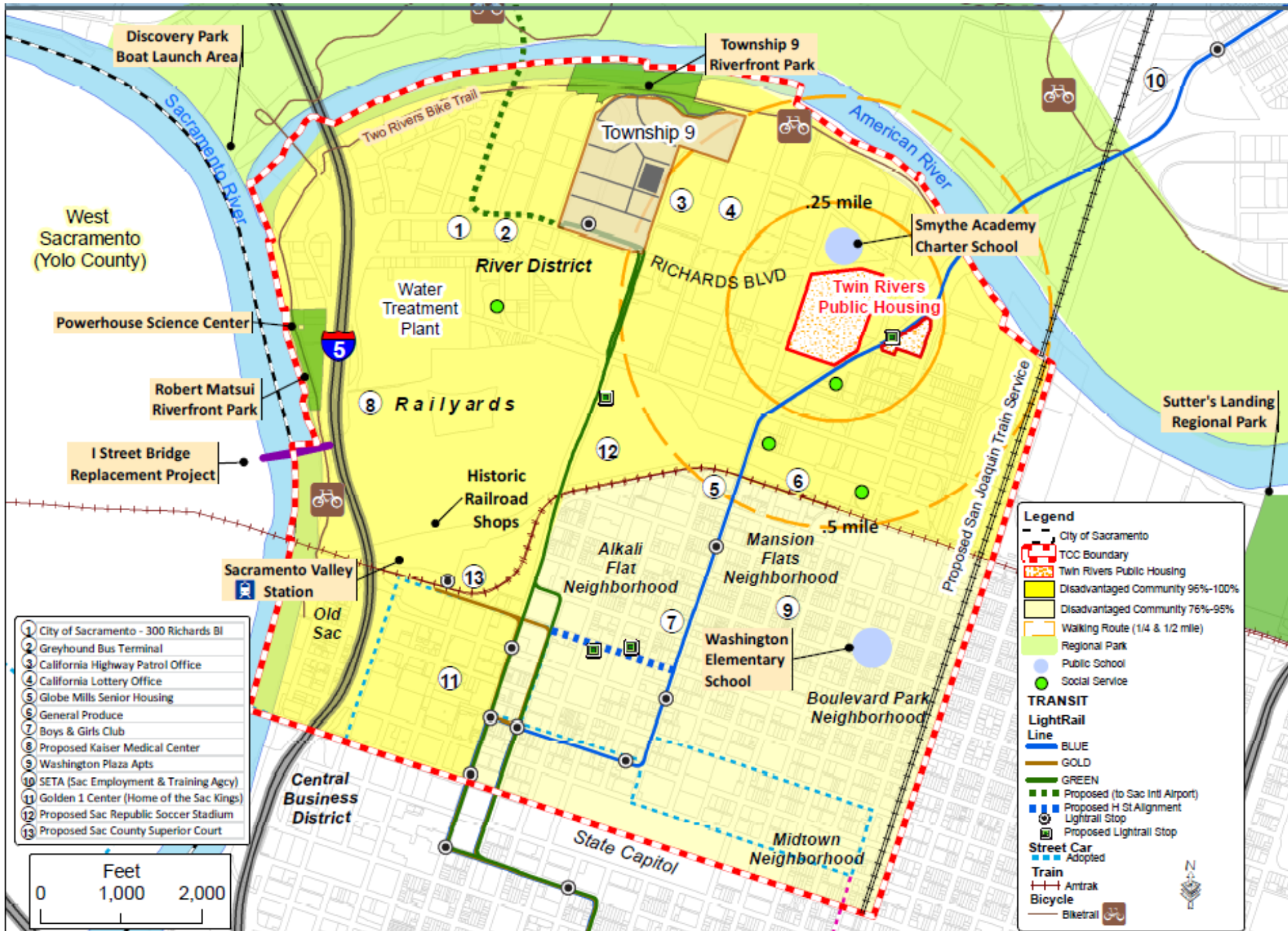
What is the Transformative Climate Community grant?

UPDATES: PROJECT DIRECTION

- 10/8 Call Project Direction – SacRT New Light rail Station
- Known Impact to GHG score – 2018 methodology tool (LCTOP vs TIRCP)
- Budget Implications
- Discussed at length among co-applicants = Consensus
- Light rail Project: Attention to economic development and workforce development

Rationale:

1. Residents and stakeholders wanted this project (strong support and need)
2. Co-applicants wanted the proposal to reflect the community's true issues and need
3. Alternative strategies would cost millions and not solve the transit problem
