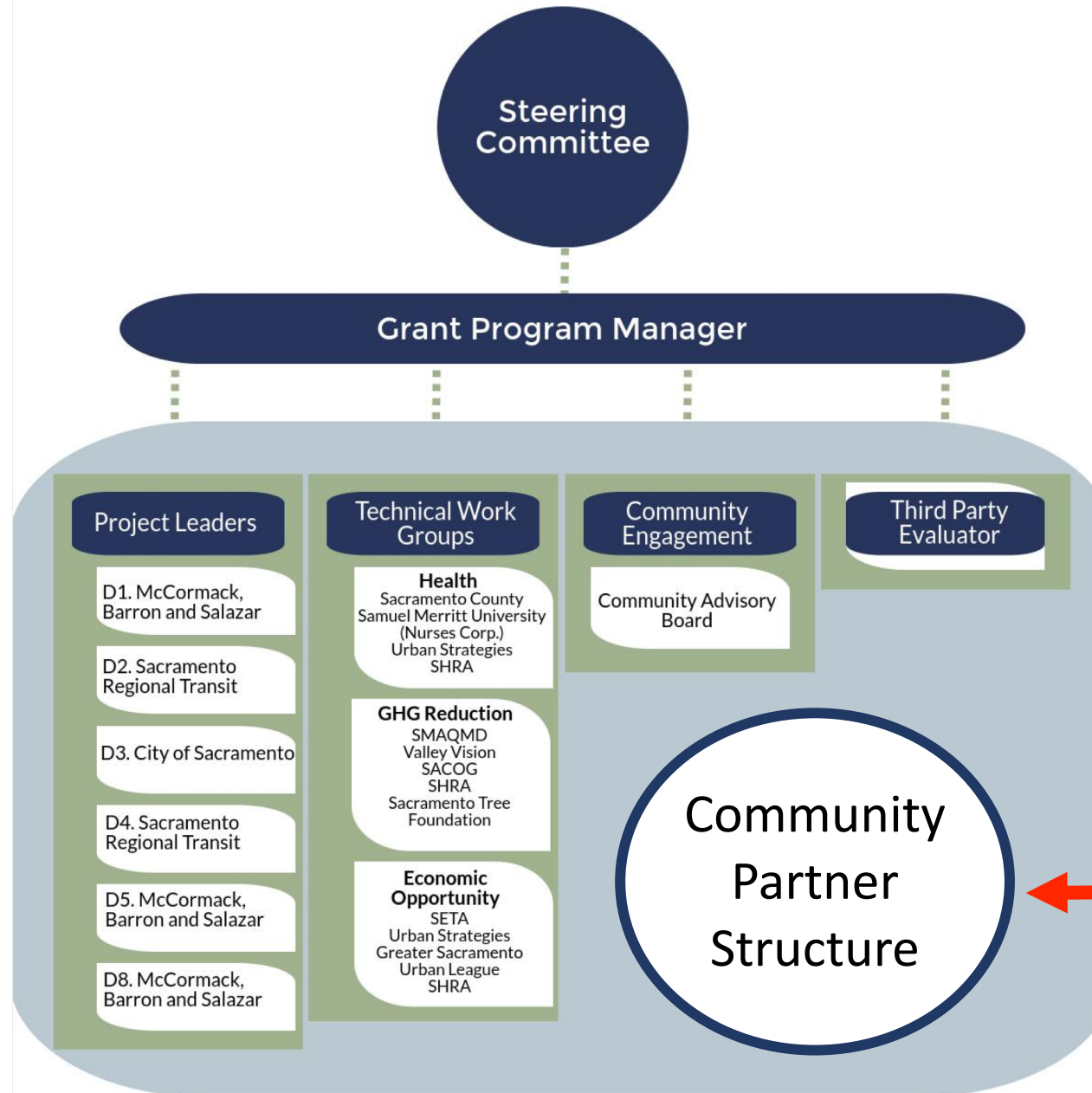

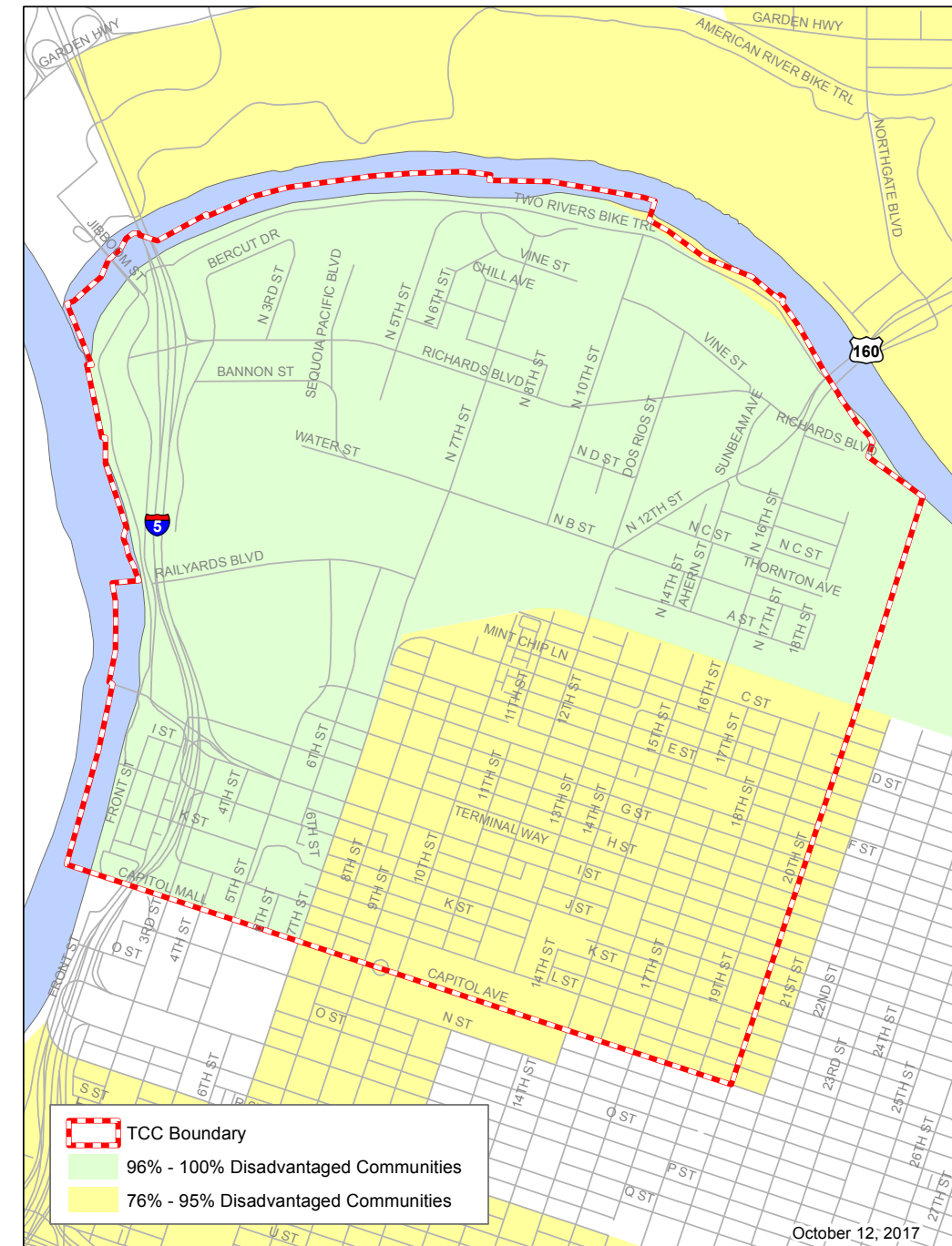

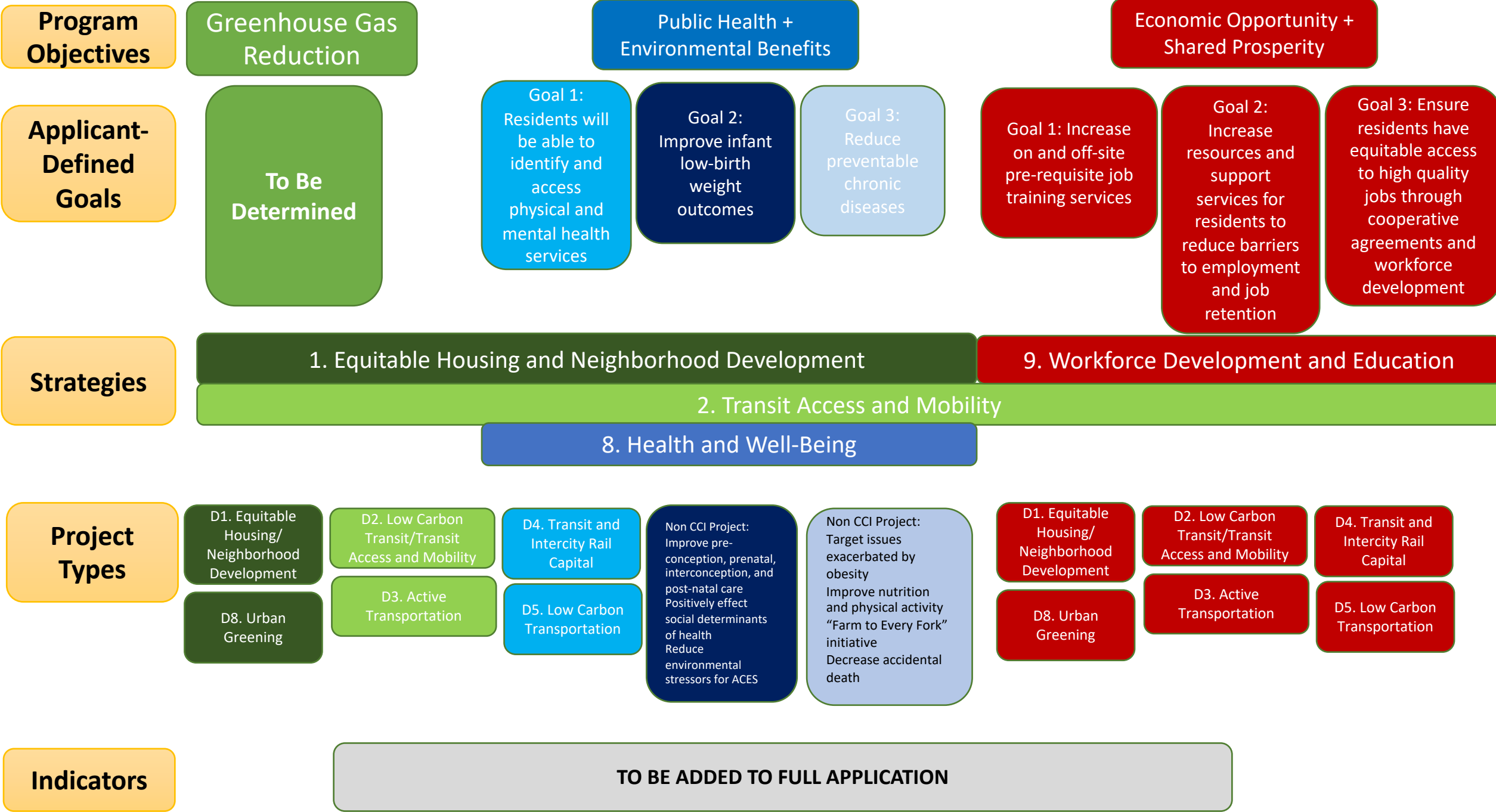

Ensure residents have equitable access to high quality jobs through cooperative agreements and workforce development	Ensure residents have equitable access to high quality jobs <u>in the project area</u> through cooperative agreements and workforce development

Project Types

D1. Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities Program	Affordable housing and associated infrastructure, bikeways, pedestrian walkways and facilities, lightening, benches/street features, bicycle parking, traffic calming projects
D2. Low Carbon Transit Operations Program	Operations expenses: travel vouchers, bus/rail service expansion equipment acquisition, intermodal transit facilities
D3. Active Transportation	Bike share program, construction of paved bike paths
D4. Transit and Intercity Rail Capital	RT track re-alignment
D5. Low Carbon Transportation	EV Charging Stations
D6. Low-Income Weatherization	Retrofits and upgrades to energy efficient standards
D8. Urban Greening	Park, green streets/alleyways, urban heat islands mitigation, non-motorized trails to connect to schools, workplaces, commercial centers, storm water projects including permeable surfaces
